

PRESIDENT'S AWARD (Council Level)

The President's Award recognizes a Service Unit for achievement of the high retention rates and achieving diversity among Troop/Group Leaders/Coordinators and other assigned goals. The award is presented at the Annual Meeting of the Council

Criteria:

1. The Service Team must achieve a 75% retention rate of registered Troop Leaders/Group Coordinators.
2. The Service Team must show diversity relative to the population of support personnel.
3. The Service Team must show positive community awareness through civic group contacts and Troop/Group Sponsors.
4. The Service Team must submit on time council reports
5. The Service Team must show evidence of proven communication efforts with leaders and individually registered Girl Scouts in their area.
6. The Service Team must show a high percentage of troops/groups participation in the Family Partnership program.

Nomination:

An individual or group familiar with the service performed submits a completed application that documents the service to the council's recognition's task group.

The Field Executive responsible for the assigned Service Unit or area must endorse all documentation.

Approval:

The recognition's task group reviews the application and recommends approval or denial to the council board of directors. The council board of directors approves or denies the award and notifies the recognition's task group. The recognition's task group notifies the nominating group or individual.

Form of Recognition:

A plate is inscribed with the name of the Service Unit and appropriate year date. This plate is added to the President's Award plaque and is displayed in the library/resource room at the council headquarters.
